#### From Libby Gore

• I'd like to suggest runner up awards to high point.

Unfortunately, the club does not have the funds to supply runner up awards. Some awards only had a couple of people contesting them. If Libby can arrange sponsorship of the runner up awards the committee is happy to announce this. Otherwise as a compromise it was suggested that the Runner Up can get a "Certificate of Recognition".

- Further communication when dates are being moved or cancelled. This last season wasn't communicated.
  - Current Committee wasn't sure what this related too but will take it on board to make sure if there are any changes it will be advertised.
- Keep up the early finishes, keep trail to after Hunter and Western Pleasure events or run it consecutively with ridden events.

Club cannot afford two Judges, one for indoor events then another for the Trail. We will need to stay with 1 Judge per show.

- Keep fb posts relevant to club events etc.
  - All agreed that we can put other items on our FB page which are club related but also Western Industry or Horse related. It keeps people interested to see what we are doing.
- A clinic would be great this year, would suggest Lauren Louw who covers a lot of different disciplines

We ran a very successful clinic last November with Cody Parrish. The club will try and organise a Clinic for November this year, David Pearce has been approached already but everyone was happy to have Lauren Louw as well if there is enough interest.

#### From Tracey Foster

• Beginner/ newcomer days, with a half day free pen time then some mock classes to help new people out.

Our Open Day scheduled for 4<sup>th</sup> August is aimed at attracting newcomers/beginners. We will look at the format done in previous years and makes some changes to keep things fresh. As always it is getting people to volunteer their time to run such events is difficult.

 Practice days, where mentors (our more experienced riders) can offer help to new people.

This can be incorporated into our Open Day. One issue is getting people to come along and mentor.

- Clinics, they don't always have to be the big names, just respected horse people. Or people who know the rule book and can give you ways to polish up your performance.
  - See comment above re running a clinic in November with a local clinician.
- A presentation day, where you can bring your horse and learn to do better banding, braids etc. Some people enjoy prepping their own horse but would like to do a better job at it.
  - Good idea and new Committee to see if this can be incorporated into the Open Day.
- Stable maintenance at the grounds to improve.

  Incoming Committee has a new portfolio which incorporates II Cadore and liaising with Valda and Stable Management.

 Run a High Point event where you must attend Shows run by CCQHA, SQHA, CWPC & NEQHA. The Classes would be Western Pleasure, Trail, Halter & Hunter Under Saddle.
